#### **OBSERVATIONS:**


- Most of the students felt satisfied with the course content and the lab components prescribed to them.


- The faculty opined that there is a need to introduce new programs in UG and PG in line with new technologies.

- ➤ The students are advised to make use of digital library resources effectively for reference other than prescribed text books.
- The teachers are encouraged to pursue M. Phil's and Ph. D's by extending financial help and incentives.

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
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**ALUMNI FEEDBACK 2018-19** 



#### 2018-19

The feedback was collected from 110 alumni and the observations are noted as follows

#### Observations

- It is noted that the admission procedure is excellent.
- It is observed that there is a need to bring about a change in evaluation system.
- There is a need to enhance the canteen facilities.
- Training and placement facilities are to be strengthened.

#### **Action Taken:**

- It is proposed to modify the evaluation procedure by including one internal and one external valuations for PG Courses.
- More varieties and hygiene conditions are properly taken care of.
- CRT classes are increased to reach the expectations of the recruitment procedure.

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
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**2018-19:** The feedback was collected from 760 parents and the observations are noted as follows

#### **Observations**

- The discipline in the college has been maintained strictly without any deviations.
- Extra- curricular activities are enhanced in addition to the academic activities.
- Though canteen facilities have showed an improvement, it is suggested to increase the varieties of food items.

#### **Action Taken:**

- The discipline committee has been instructed to monitor the behaviour of students in the campus during break hours.
- Co-Curricular activities have been extended with the involvement of various clubs and committees.
- According to the suggestions, varieties of dishes have been included in the menu as per the students' interests and subsidized rates.



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
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**2018-19:** The feedback was collected from 27 Employers and the observations are noted as follows **Observations:** 

- Nearly 74% felt that curriculum is relevant for employability
- Nearly 48% felt that the curriculum is not suitable for entrepreneurship
- Very few thought that the curriculum is good to open new ideas and techniques
- There were mixed opinions regarding to overall rating of the colleges

#### **Action Taken:**

New courses B.Sc. (Data Science) and B.Sc.(IoT) were introduced.
